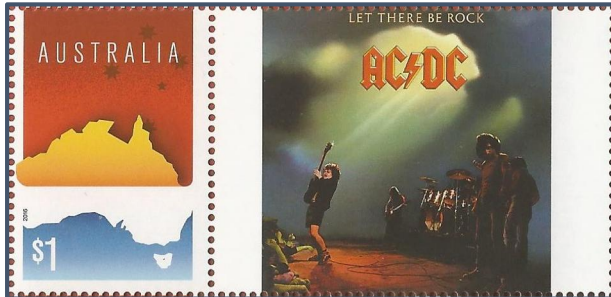


After Corona ...

The anticipation of an open-air concert or festival always begins when you get hold of one of the tickets that are often sold out very quickly.



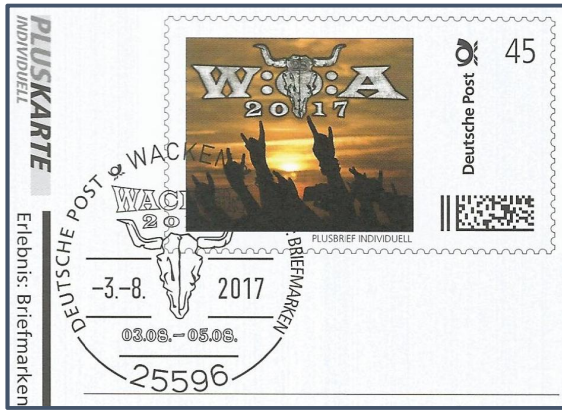

One of the largest open-air festivals in Germany is Wacken, up north in Schleswig-Holstein!

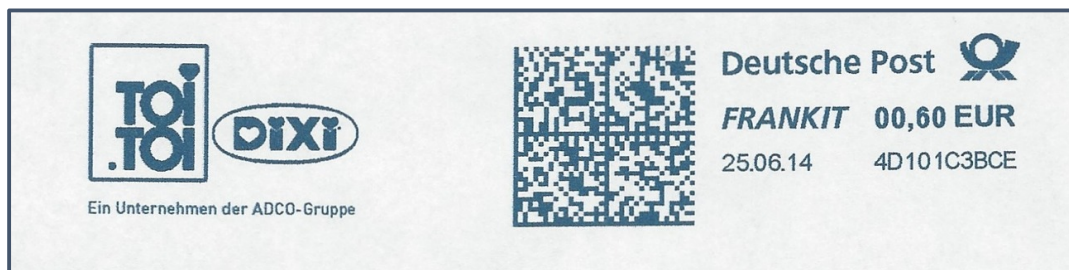
